OVERVIEW

Share price €21.80 (discount to NAV: 20%) BGHL is a closed-ended investment company which invests in BG Fund, Boussard & Gavaudan's flagship fund with 18 years of track record.

BGHL's investment objective is to deliver an annual return, net of fees, of 400 to 600 basis points above the risk-free rate over the business cycle, irrespective of market performance. The risk-free rate is "capitalized EONIA".

BG Fund is driven by bottom-up fundamental and event catalyst research, combined with extensive multi-asset arbitrage and derivative expertise. Typically, investment ideas are catalyst driven with a focus on special situations and events.

Capital is dynamically allocated to the firm's best ideas and these ideas are categorized into four main types of strategies: Equity, Volatility, Credit and Trading strategies.

II. OVERVIEW

Boussard & Gavaudan Holding Limited ("BGHL") is a Guernsey closed-ended investment company and is registered with the Dutch Authority for the Financial Markets as a collective investment scheme under article 1:107 of the Dutch Financial Markets Supervision Act. BGHL invests its assets in order to provide exposure to multiple alternative investment strategies managed by the Investment Manager. The investment objective is to produce long-term appreciation of its assets. BGHL seeks to achieve this by investing in BG Fund ("the Fund"). In addition, a proportion of the net assets of BGHL may, at the discretion of the Investment Manager, be invested in other hedge funds and financial assets selected by the Investment Manager. BGHL aims to generate a target NAV annualized return of Eonia capitalized + 400/600 bps over the business cycle, net of all fees.

V. BGHL COMPOSITION

BGHL is invested in BG Fund (net of an amount retained by BGHL for working capital and other requirements).

As of 1 July 2021, 99.52% of BGHL net asset value is invested in BG Fund. BGHL has a maximum exposure limit to BG Fund of 110%. The remained BGHL net asset value is made up of direct investment and cash.

A. BG FUND

European markets took a pause in June from the previous rallying trend with the Eurostoxx 50® Total Return up +0.7% for the month. The iTraxx Crossover® (S35) finished June at 232bps (15bps tighter on the month). Implied volatility decreased slightly with VStoxx® ending the month at 18.2% down from 19.1%.

BG Fund was slightly positive in June returning +0.04% (USD A estimate) for the month. Positive results in volatility and credit strategies were held back by underperformance in equity and trading strategies.

COMMENTARY

Volatility strategies

Mandatory convertible bond arbitrage

Mandatory convertible bonds contributed +12bps this month due to a combination of general positive repricing and to specific performance on SBB, a Swedish real estate company, which offered an incentive for early conversion of its mandatory bonds. June saw the welcome return of primary market activity in mandatory convertibles with a new USD1.3bn issue from Clarivate a UK-based data and innovation company. The bonds have a 5.25% coupon and should deliver attractive returns and trading opportunities over their 3 year maturity to June 2024.

Convertible bond arbitrage

Convertible bonds contributed +1bp to the performance of the fund in June. Primary and secondary markets were quiet, with limited demand from long-only investors and hedge funds. Most CBs both in Europe and in the US consequently saw declines this month. Against this backdrop, our portfolio was slightly up mainly thanks to our volatility exposures, with realised volatility of specific underlying names picking up. For example, ASOS was a good performer and we believe it remains good value compared to comparable names such as Zalando.

Volatility trading was flat in June. Markets had been expected to be more volatile, with investors cautiously monitoring for a change in guidance from central banks, however, despite a slightly more hawkish message than had been anticipated, volatility remained muted across asset classes.

Over the course of the month there was an over-supply of gamma ahead of quarterly expiries, followed by a very minor market correction which did not generate any stress in volatility. Volatility normalisation was the main theme in

June, with volatility now roughly back to pre-Covid levels in many situations. This led to poor volatility carry which impacted the portfolio due to our long gamma bias. Nevertheless, this drag was offset by decent moves in specific single stocks (Biogen and Nike) and our VIX positions which also contributed positively.

Warrant arbitrage

Warrant and SPAC arbitrage contributed +15bps in June.

Equity strategies

In June, the equity portfolio returned -31bps overall with decent gains on several core positions offset by a number of smaller losses.

One of our long-held core positions, OSRAM, completed its delisting move to a secondary exchange, with every shareholder who wanted to exit selling to the cash offer from AMS, which reached 80.3% ownership of the company. The stock rallied to finish the month up 2% following completion of this exercise.

The portfolio also benefited from our long position in SBANKEN, as DNB sweetened its offer by 5% to reach the 90% threshold needed to squeeze out shareholders.

Negative performance was spread across a few positions, with some coming from a risk arbitrage position in the acquisition of the insurance broker Willis Towers Watson by its competitor Aon. While the antitrust process seems to be progressing well in Europe with remedies offered, the DOJ unexpectedly decided to file an antitrust suit against the merger causing the spread to widen from 5% to 11%. The two companies still seem very committed to the transaction and at current levels we still think there is a route forward from here and the position remains interesting based on our risk reward analysis.

Our position in KPN was also impacted in June. EQT and other infrastructure funds were working on a bid for the company, and in our view the share price only reflected a small bid premium, however disappointingly EQT confirmed that they would not make an offer, and the stock finished the month down 3%.

Our position in Playtech also finished the month down due to sustained selling pressure from one major shareholder and market disappointment on the price achieved for the sale of Finalto, its CFD trading arm. A new potential buyer has however emerged for this division since month end, so we will see how the situation evolves.

Credit strategies

Capital Structure Arbitrage

Capital structure arbitrage was flat in June.

Credit long / short

Credit long short delivered +18bps this month.

Credit markets have continued to tighten remarkably during the month of June, with the Crossover index along with US CDX high yield both tightening by 15bps.

A top performer this month was CGG with a spread tightening of 60bps as it continued to rally following its restructuring and helped by the outperformance of an energy sector buoyed by oil prices.

Credit special situations

Credit Special Situation delivered +13bps for the month as the portfolio continued to adjust upward in June with notable performance from KCA which also benefited from improved sentiment in the oil market.

Trading

Trading contributed -26bps in June due primarily to the CTA which was impacted by deteriorating commodity and currency markets.

The Equity quantitative strategy had a slightly positive contribution in June. Inflation was a significant concern, holding back performance until the Fed meeting after which inflation expectations in the US decreased, the yield curve flattened, and growth stocks outperformed.

On the CTA, commodities, which had been a reliable source of profit since the start of the year, suffered a significant correction in base metals, grains, and lumber while energy futures (carbon emissions, oil and other fuels) kept climbing. The second factor for weak performance was the appreciation of the US dollar, which wrong-footed most positions, apart from against Swiss Franc and Yen. Our long stock index positions were able to generate profit, as stocks are still grinding ahead, however it was not a broad-based bull market: only the S&P, Nasdaq, and a few European indices like SMI advanced markedly.

Macro trading also contributed slightly negatively in June. Our European bank position was the main negative contributor. We expect likely Fed tightening in a context of peak growth and peak profits to be less favorable for risk appetite. As such we closed our global reflation trades and remain defensively positioned over the summer.

B. <u>DIRECT INVESTMENTS OTHER THAN BG FUND</u>

On top of its investment in BG Fund, BGHL has other investments. As of 30 June 2021, the net asset value of these investments represents less than 1.00% of the net asset value of BGHL.

Rasaland Investors ("RLI")

Rasaland Investors ("RLI") RLI is a Malta-based holding company structured as a private equity fund in terms of fees and organisation and managed by BK Partners. RLI is dedicated to land, hotels and high-end resort developments in Mexico. RLI's main asset is a majority interest in ACTUR, a private company owning the land developing assets. ACTUR's other shareholders are Mexican public institutions.

In July 2020, RLI made a cash tender offer to buy back its own shares, for a price per share of US\$0.12270. The valuation of BGHL's investment in RLI shares was marked down on 31 August 2020, using the US\$0.12270 per share price as the estimated fair value of the RLI shares. This price represents a circa 80% discount to the latest published NAV per share.

Hedge Funds Liquidation Stress Tests

Stress tests' scenarios have been improved in order to take into account liquidity issues. This scenario aims at reflecting, to some extent, how the fund would react in distressed market environment (as was the case in late 2008). These stress tests combine the three following adjustments:

• Small, Mid and Large caps adjustment

In certain market conditions, beta may become much higher than its level in normal market conditions and thus the hedging of such positions may not be effective. To address this kind of circumstance we apply a corrective factor to the beta of small, mid and large caps respectively. Since April 2019, the corrective factors have been calibrated on the amplitude of the stresses by looking at worst historical scenario since 1987.

• Risk arbitrage adjustment

The risk of risk arbitrage positions is taken into account differently in case the market drops by more than 10%. We consider that one third of risk arbitrage positions will collapse.

Liquidity adjustment

An average discount (realized in 2008) is applied to bond, convertible bond (including mandatory convertible bond) and loan prices in case credit spreads widen by more than 25%.
